House Rules

The following rules apply to and concern the general behaviour expected at the Conference:

1. All delegates, Chairpersons, StOff, Staff, and MUN-Directors shall conduct themselves in English.
2. The Rules of Procedure have been put together by the Conference Managers of the Organising Committee. Accordingly, any disputes or unclarity concerning the Rules of Procedure should be brought up to, and subsequently handled by the Conference Managers or the Secretary-General.
3. Delegates may always appeal to decisions made by the chair; should their appeal be legitimate, a Conference Manager or the Secretary-General must be called upon to decide on the appeal.
4. By taking part in CalsMUN 2020 one consents to the fact that images, be it photographic or video, are taken of them and may be used by means such as, but not limited to; posting on social media, usage in publicity media, and for in and out of school purposes.
5. The consumption of alcohol, drugs, or other intoxicating devices is strictly forbidden during the Conference and any events associated with it. The use of such substances is not tolerated and will result in a removal from the conference.
6. Commonly recognised hate-symbols, including but not limited to the Swastika, are banished from being displayed or used in any way during the Conference.
7. The Organising Committee reserves the right to refrain from giving out certificates to delegates who have violated rules or who have misbehaved.

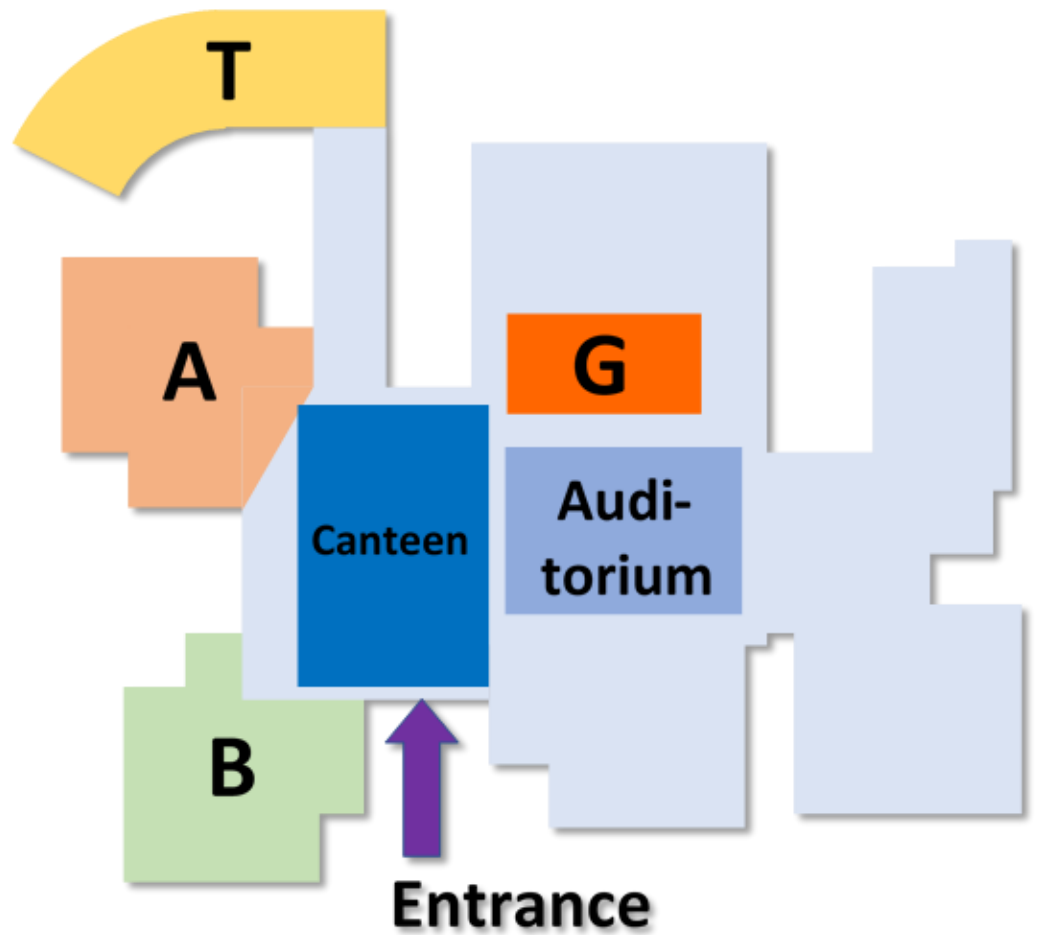

Motions, Points and Forms of Address

It can be difficult for a delegate to remember all forms of speech and all the convoluted jargon used by his/her colleagues during sessions, which is why you can find a list of the most important motions, points and forms of address below. Take note that, whilst points do not need to be seconded, motions do.

Motion or Point	Reason and Effect
Point of Information	Used for asking a delegation a question after his/her speech
Point of Order	Used for informing the chair about a procedural error
Point of Personal Privilege	Used for asking the chair for a personal, quality of life improvement
Point of Parliamentary Inquiry	Used for asking the chair about a clarification of the rules of procedure
Point of Information to the Chair	Used for asking the chair about anything not covered by the point above
Motion to Divide the House	Used for proposing a vote in which all delegations are obligated to take a side
Motion to Extend Debating Time	Used for extending the time allocated to giving speeches and asking questions
Motion to Move to the Previous Question	Used for ceasing the debate on a current issue, and commencing debate on the following issue
Motion to Adjourn Debate	Used for proposing a short pause in the debating
Motion to Table the Resolution	Used for putting aside the current resolution and starting debate on the following resolution

Pre-ambulatory & Operative Clauses

One of the most tedious, yet potentially most interesting parts of writing a resolution is, of course, choosing the wording with which to start your clauses. What with there being so many options, and the general unclarity that may arise from the use of so many different openings, we have compiled a list of frequently used clause openings below. They are subdivided into Preambulatory and Operative Clauses, i.e. clauses used for stating the reasons for your resolution and clauses used for solving the issues diagnosed in the former.
